COLONEL BRIAN D. SHERRY

Col Brian D. Sherry is the Vice Commander, 603d Air Operations Center, Ramstein Air Base, Germany. In this capacity, he advises the commander while leading a joint force of over 600 Airmen, Guardians, Soldiers, Sailors, and Marines executing command and control of air, information, and space operations throughout the European and African theaters. The 603d Air Operations Center forms the core of a \$1.9 billion Weapon System for United States Air Forces in Europe and Air Forces Africa allowing the Joint Forces Air Component Commander, Regional Air Defense Commander, and Operations leadership to secure national objectives and achieve air/space/cyber/info superiority.

Col Sherry received his commission from the U.S. Air Force Academy in 1999 and attended Euro-NATO Joint Jet pilot training at Sheppard Air Force Base, Texas. Following F-16 qualification training at Luke AFB, Arizona, his first assignments brought him to Pacific Air Forces, United States Air Forces in Europe, and Air Combat Command. He transitioned to the Vermont Air National Guard in 2011, is a command pilot with more than 3,300 hours in F-16 and F-35 fighter aircraft, and a graduate of the U.S. Air Force Weapons School.



During his career, Col Sherry has served as a commander, strategic planner, operational test pilot, instructor pilot, flight examiner, functional check, and Forward Air Controller (Airborne). He has over 660 combat hours and operational experience in multiple theatres including Southwest Asia, the Pacific, Eastern Europe, and the continental United States during Operations NOBLE EAGLE, CONSTANT EFFORT, IRAQI FREEDOM, ENDURING FREEDOM, and INHERENT RESOLVE. In his civilian career, Col Sherry is a pilot with a major airline. Prior to assuming his current position, Col Sherry was the Wing Plans Officer, 158th Fighter Wing, South Burlington, Vermont.
