BRIGADIER GENERAL KEVIN V. DOYLE

Brig. Gen. Kevin V. Doyle is the Air National Guard Assistant to the Commander, United States Air Forces in Europe - Air Forces Africa (USAFE-AFAFRICA). General Doyle is responsible for advising Commander USAFE-AFAFRICA on air and space operations, including missile defense, to three Combatant Commanders spanning three continents and 104 countries throughout Europe, Africa and the Middle East. He also leads the Command's engagements with the National Guard State Partnership Program.

General Doyle earned his commission as a distinguished graduate in 1989 through the Academy of Military Science, McGhee Tyson Air National Guard Base, Tennessee. He then completed Undergraduate Navigator Training at Mather Air Force Base, California and F-4 Replacement Training Unit George Air Force Base, California. General Doyle was selected to attend Euro-North Atlantic Treaty Organization Joint Jet Pilot Training at Shepperd Air Force Base, Texas prior to attending F-16 training at McConnell AFB, Kansas. General Doyle is a graduate of the U.S. Air Force Weapons Instructor Course (F-16) with more than 4,000 flying hours in the F-16, A-10C, F-4E, AT/T-38, and T-37, including more than



128 combat missions, totaling more than 400 combat hours. His career spans 39 years and includes service as both an Air Force officer and an enlisted Marine. Prior to assuming his current position, General Doyle served as the Air National Guard Assistant to Commander, Continental U.S. North American Aerospace Defense Command Region - 1st Air Force (Air Forces Northern), Tyndall Air Force Base, FL, NORAD Deputy Combined Forces Air Component Commander (CFACC), Chief of Staff for the Indiana Air National Guard and in a variety of unit command and headquarters positions with both the Ohio and Indiana National Guard. Throughout his career he has participated in military operations to include PACAF Theater Security Plan and Operations SOUTHERN WATCH, NORTHERN WATCH, IRAQI FREEDOM, ENDURING FREEDOM.
