COLONEL JOHN F. GONZALES

Colonel John F. Gonzales is the Vice Commander, Third Air Force, Ramstein Air Base, Germany. Third Air Force exercises delegated authorities over assigned forces that include personnel management, General Courts Martial Convening Authority, and advising subordinate commands on requirements, programs, and budget. Third Air Force also works with its subordinate commands to ensure implementation and compliance with relevant policies and directives of the Department of Defense, Headquarters Air Force, and USAFE-AFAFRICA.

Colonel Gonzales entered the Air Force in 1996 after commissioning through ROTC at the University of New Mexico. He earned his wings at the Euro-NATO Joint Jet Pilot Training program, Sheppard Air Force Base. Col Gonzales has commanded at the wing, group, and squadron level while also serving at the NAF, MAJCOM, and Joint Staff levels.

Colonel Gonzales is a command pilot with more than 2,400 flying hours and 179 combat hours. He has participated in Operations SOUTHERN WATCH, ENDURING FREEDOM, UNIFIED RESPONSE, DEEP WATER HORIZON, and INHERENT RESOLVE.



Prior to assuming his current position, Col Gonzales was the Commander of the 51st Fighter Wing, Osan Air Base, Republic of Korea. In this role, he was responsible for over 5,500 personnel and the employment of F-16 and A-10C fighter aircraft.
